DRIVES. The hills and valleys of the region round about give opportunities for beautiful drives in all directions.


LAKESIDE provides a good table with fresh vegetables, milk, cream, chickens and eggs supplied by the farm.

Altogether it will be found to be a healthful, quiet resort.


